Background



- The Engaged Research (ER) Project, funded by the NRF, aims to develop a coordinated approach towards engaged research in the NSI.
- This will be achieved through an exploration of ways in which an engaged research agenda can be established and engaged research principles and methods can be strengthened, sustained, and leveraged for impact across the NSI.
- To achieve this aim, mapping out the various stakeholders in the field is a foundational activity.
- Stakeholder Mapping is an important tool that allows you to analyze stakeholders, develop stakeholder management plans, and more effectively engage with stakeholders.







Background



- We need to know the stakeholders working in engaged research to be able to:
 - understand their experiences;
 - broaden participation between stakeholders;
 - facilitate interactions;
 - guide the transfer of knowledge; and
 - feed into new projects and collaborations.







Key questions



The key questions driving the Stakeholder Mapping are:

- 1. Who is working in engaged research, including individuals, groups and organizations?
- 2. What type of engaged research are they doing?
- 3. What topic and sector are they working in?
- 4. Who is funding engaged research?
- 5. How can we build a community of practice around engaged research?








Methodology











Methodology



- 1. Compile a list of NSI and other entities that may be relevant to engaged research
- 2. Use snowballing techniques to find additional entities working in the engaged research space
- Desktop searches to find information on engaged research work conducted by these entities
- 4. A short online survey to find additional entities and individuals working in engaged research and more information on the engaged research work being done
- 5. Develop an online stakeholder map






